Before the Service begins

As you wait for the service to begin, pray for a few people around you. Think of people who are unable to attend and bring them before the Lord in prayer.

Ask God to meet us and change us today. The following prayer is a good one to use:

Almighty God, to whom all hearts are open, all desires known, and from whom no secrets are hidden: cleanse the thoughts of our hearts by the inspiration of your Holy Spirit that we may perfectly love you, and worthily magnify your holy name, through Christ our Lord.

Amen.

CALL: God gathers us

In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

This is the day that the LORD has made. Let us rejoice and be glad in it.

[Psalm 118:24]

Praise the LORD, O all you nations; all you peoples, sing his praise. For his love is great towards us; his commitment lasts always. He is faithful now and ever. Hallelujah! Praise the Lord!

[Psalm 117 from Sing Psalms]

As you come to Jesus, the living Stone, you are living stones being built into a temple of the Spirit, to be a holy priesthood, offering spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ.

We are a chosen people, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's special possession, so that we may declare the praises of him who called us out of darkness into his wonderful light.

Once you were not a people but now we are God's people.
Once you had not received mercy but now we have received mercy.

[1 Peter 2:4-5, 9-10]

CONFESSION: God cleanses us

You have been born again, not of perishable seed, but of imperishable, through the living and enduring word of God. Therefore rid yourselves of all malice and all deceit, hypocrisy, envy and slander of every kind.

[1 Peter 1:23, 2:1]

Almighty God, our heavenly Father, we have sinned against you and against our neighbour in thought and word and deed, through negligence, through weakness, through our own deliberate fault.

We are truly sorry and repent of all our sins.

For the sake of your Son Jesus Christ, who died for us, forgive us all that is past and grant that we may serve you in newness of life to the glory of your name.

Amen.

This, or another Bible verse, will be used to declare the promise of forgiveness.

Christ himself bore our sins in his body on the cross, so that we might die to sins and live for righteousness, for by his wounds you have been healed.

[1 Peter 2:24]

May God who loved the world so much that he sent his Son to be our Saviour forgive you your sins and make you holy to serve him in the world, through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

The Collect (set prayer for today)

CONSECRATION: God speaks and transforms us

The first Bible reading ends with this Response:

This is the Word of the Lord. Thanks be to God.

Please stand for the Gospel reading

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to *N*: **Glory to you, O Lord.**

After the reading:

This is the Gospel of the Lord: **Praise to you, O Christ.**

Remain standing for the Apostles' Creed.

Let us affirm our faith in the living God:

I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again; he ascended to heaven, he is seated at the right hand of the Father, and he will come to judge the living and the dead.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

Prayers

Some of the prayers may end in this way:

Lord, in your mercy, hear our prayer.

Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name. Your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as in heaven. Give us today our daily bread. Forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sin against us. Lead us not into temptation but deliver us from evil. For the kingdom, the power and the glory are yours, now and forever. Amen.

COMMISSION: God sends us

Holy Spirit, you stir us to love and good works: strengthen us to fight against sin, the world, and the devil so that your will, not ours, may be done.

Father, Son and Holy Spirit, you have saved us: send us into the world to proclaim your gospel. Amen.
