RBT Sunday

On the First Sunday of each month the sermon will normally be based on the book(s) that we have been reading. The RBT Feedback may show that the Holy Spirit has been speaking in a focused way into the life of St George's Church. So the sermon will be prepared only after the feedback has been given.

The Questions We Ask

God has told us why the Bible was given. The questions we ask each month reflect these reasons. We can be sure that these are the *right questions to ask and answer* because this is why the author, the Spirit, wrote this book. The Bible references show you the inspiration for these questions.

- What did you learn about Jesus? (Luke 24:45-47)
- What did you learn about yourself / human nature? (James 1:23 & 2 Tim 3:16-17)
- How can you look like Jesus in the place that you have been sent by Jesus? (John 17:17-18)
- How were you corrected and rebuked; how do you feel you need to change to be the man/woman of God thoroughly equipped for every good work?
 (2 Timothy 3:16-17)
- What did you learn from the Scriptures that will help you endure and be encouraged? (Romans 15:4)
- What did you learn that will teach you to do works of service to build up the church at St George's? (Ephesians 4:11-16)
- What have you learnt that helps you love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind, and what has helped you love your neighbour as yourself? (Matthew 22:37-40)

You are not expected to write down *everything* that might be an answer to each question. This is not a test! These questions are like glasses, helping your vision focus on what is in front of you. Each month you will be given a sheet of paper with these questions. Write down the truths and verses that speak to you.
